We have asked Alexis Smith (who is currently minoring in Indigenous Studies) to prepare us some information on Indigenous issues that relate to our church:.

Who are the Haudenosaunee (Ho-deh-no-show-nee) peoples? You have probably heard of these peoples referred to as the Iroquois or Six Nations. The Haudenosaunee Confederacy, a historical confederacy that still operates today, is an alliance comprised initially of five nations: the Cayuga, Oneida, Onondaga, Mohawk, and Seneca. This sixth nation, the Tuscarora nation, joined the confederacy later in 1722. The Haudenosaunee peoples are native to parts of Ontario and upstate New York. The Six Nations of the Grand River, a Haudenosaunee community, is the largest reserve in Canada located near Brantford, Ontario. Other Haudenosaunee communities in Ontario include Oneida Nation of the Thames and Tyendinaga which is near Belleville, Ontario.
