Our readings are taken from the Revised Common Lectionary a 3 year cycle of readings used by many Christian denominations. Next week's lectionary readings will be: Genesis 15:1–12, 17–18; Psalm 27; Philippians 3:17-4:1; Luke 13:31-35

We have asked Alexis Smith (who is currently minoring in Indigenous Studies) to prepare us some information on Indigenous issues that relate to our church:

The following announcement contains very upsetting information pertaining to sexual and physical abuse. It is important to know the truth, but please take care of yourselves as this is a heavy topic.

Conditions at residential schools were horrific. Seeing as Indigenous peoples were viewed as dirty, students' bodies and hair were often washed with toxic chemicals. Children were fed inadequately, and nutritional experiments performed on the children were not uncommon (for example, what are the effects of prolonged protein deprivation?). If a child were to fall sick, medical treatment was often withheld, and again, medical experiments on children were not uncommon. Physical and sexual abuse occurred at horrifyingly high rates. Children faced cruel physical punishments for any form of "disobedience" and even innocent accidents such as bed wetting. There have been 38,000 claims of sexual and serious physical abuse suffered within residential schools (Belanger, 2018). This number does not account for the abuse suffered by the children who died while attending residential school nor does it account for the survivors who, for whatever reason, are unable to come forward about their abuse. The Truth and Reconciliation Commission documents 3.201 recorded deaths that occurred within residential schools as a result of poor nutrition, amplified rates of disease as a result of poor sanitation and lack of medical attention, accidental deaths, and suicide (Belanger, 2018). However, one commissioner, Murray Sinclair, believes the number is more than 6000 (Belanger, 2018).
