PWS&D Responds to Malawi Floods

On March 6, 2019, a tropical disturbance over Mozambique brought heavy rains and flooding to parts of southern Malawi. Thirteen districts have been severely impacted by the deluge, which has damaged infrastructure and affected electricity and water supplies. Water sources have been contaminated and water-borne diseases, as well as cholera and malaria outbreaks, are posing serious health risks.

Dozens of people have died and hundreds of thousands have been impacted. The number of people in need continues to rise. Please continue to keep the people and communities in southern Malawi in your prayers.

PWS&D is in close contact with partners in the affected area who are monitoring the situation and coordinating a response. PWS&D will continue to work with local communities to assess damage and meet the most immediate needs.

ACT Alliance members in Malawi have identified food security, nutrition, psychosocial support, and water and sanitation as the priority areas of need.

International Ministries staff, the Rev. Dr. Blair and Vivian Bertrand, are serving in southern Malawi and providing updates on the situation.

PWS&D is accepting donations to in the wake of flooding.

Our readings are taken from the Revised Common Lectionary a 3 year cycle of readings used by many Christian denominations. Next week's lectionary readings will be: Joshua 5:9–12; Psalm 32; 2 Corinthians 5:16–21; Luke 15:1–3, 11b–32.

We have asked Alexis Smith (who is currently minoring in Indigenous Studies) to prepare us some information on Indigenous issues that relate to our church:

The Mohawk Institute is a residential school located in Brantford, Ontario. It was run by the Anglican Church and originally opened in 1828 as the Mechanics' Institute for Indigenous boys from Six Nations. In 1831 boys started boarding at the school and by 1834 a girls' dormitory was added. The building was destroyed by a fire thought to be set by students in the 1850s and a new, bigger building was constructed with the name Mohawk Institute. Increasing numbers of boys and girls started attending the residential school, especially after the 1894 amendment to the Indian Act which made residential school education mandatory for all Indigenous children. Another fire destroyed the school in 1903 which prompted the construction of the building that is still standing today. The Mohawk Institute is infamously known as the "Mush Hole", a reflection of the quality of food fed to students. Not unlike other residential schools, students at Mohawk Institute faced abuse and many died within its walls. The school closed in 1970 and in 1972 the property was turned into the Woodland Cultural Centre which is run by Indigenous people. Woodland Cultural Centre is "a non-profit organization that serves to preserve and promote First Nations culture and heritage."

(www.woodlandculturalcentre.ca/the-campaign/). I highly recommend going to the Woodland Cultural Centre's museum and taking a tour of the Mohawk Institute. It is a very educational and eye-opening experience.
