World Health Day (April 7)

Good health starts with good nutrition—especially for young children. In a poor village in Haiti, one-year-old Marcellus was losing weight rapidly and had a persistent cough. Because of crop losses, his single mother was struggling to feed the little boy and his five siblings. She knew Marcellus needed medical attention, but the price of transport to the closest health facility was more than she could afford. Hope came to Marcellus's mother in the form of a mobile

clinic supported by Presbyterian World Service & Development and other Canadian Foodgrains Bank members. There, Marcellus received a nutrient-rich food supplement called Nourimanba, antibiotics and multivitamins. Marcellus is no longer malnourished and is on course to grow up healthy and strong. PWS&D brings health care closer to home.

Report from Session

At its regular meeting this past Tuesday, St. Andrew's Kirk Session continued to work on some important tasks that have been set for it:

- We advanced our work on a covenant a set of behaviours we intend to follow and hold each other accountable to follow. Once we finish and adopt this covenant, we will share it with the congregation. One hope is that this will provide a template that may help us in many parts of the congregation.
- We received an encouraging report on youth ministry possibilities in our congregation. Joni Smith will join the session next month to advance these discussions.
- We are planning a future elder training workshop with Rev. Linda Ashfield.
- We are planning a future Leading with Care workshop with David Phillips. This workshop will include Deacons, Sustaining Elders, anyone involved with children or youth ministries and anyone else who is interested. (We will say more about Sustaining Elders in another bulletin.)
- At the last meeting a Christian Education initiative was approved. On a given Sunday, an elder would preach and Rev. Scott would leave with the children to spend some meaningful time with one of the Sunday School classes. This will take place on Sunday, May 26.
- A Presbytery workshop on maintaining healthy boundaries will be held at St. Andrew's on Saturday, May 25 (9 am - 3 pm), lunch included. This workshop will be open to anyone in the congregation.

We have asked Alexis Smith (who is currently minoring in Indigenous Studies) to prepare us some information on Indigenous issues that relate to our church:

The term "Indigenous" currently tends to be an acceptable way of referring to anyone who is First Nations, Métis, or Inuit. When you can, try to be as specific as possible, such as referring to someone with the name of the nation they come from (eg. if someone were Anishinaabe). Find out how someone wants to be referred to by asking them, because for some people, Indigenous may not be how they would like to be referred to and may prefer another term.
