Order of Online Worship for January 3

We will meet online for as long as people want to stay on at 10 am. The link will be sent out by email and posted (with a password) on the website. The sanctuary is closed for in-person worship until January 26, 2021. This will be a communion service, so please prepare communion elements ("bread" and "wine" in whatever forms work for you) before connecting.

Call to worship

L: Arise, shine: for your light has come!

P: The glory of the Lord has risen upon us.

L: Lift up your eyes and look around!

P: We shall see and be radiant; our hearts shall rejoice.

L: For the Lord will be our everlasting light and our glory!

P: And so we bring God our worship in humble expectation.

Prayers of approach and confession

L: God of light and of life, we praise you for your creation, and for the Word made flesh in the child born in Bethlehem. Open our hearts and minds in this time of worship. Just as you led the Magi by the star, lead us by your Spirit beyond the limits of this world's expectations, to the life where you make all things new through Christ, our Morning Star.

L: In recalling all that God is and does, we become aware of who we are and what we have done. Let us confess our sins together:

P: God of mercy and loving kindness, you sent Christ among us to be the light of the world and to reveal your love to all people. We confess that our sins hide the brightness of your light that should shine through us. We waste our gifts, we ignore cries for justice, we harm the earth and we do not strive for peace in the world or with each other. In your mercy, cleanse us and make us new. Amen.

L: Be assured of God's love and forgiveness that shine for us in Christ Jesus. As a new year unfolds, make a new beginning with God and with one another. May the peace of Christ be with you all.

P: And with you also!

Responsive Reading Psalm 72:1-7, 10-14

L: Give the king your justice, O God, and your righteousness to a king's son.

P: May he judge your people with righteousness, and your poor with justice.

L: May the mountains yield prosperity for the people, and the hills, in righteousness.

P: May he defend the cause of the poor of the people, give deliverance to the needy, and crush the oppressor.

L: May he live while the sun endures, and as long as the moon, throughout all generations.

P: May he be like rain that falls on the mown grass, like showers that water the earth.

L: In his days may righteousness flourish and peace abound,

P: until the moon is no more.

L: May the kings of Tarshish and of the isles render him tribute, may the kings of Sheba and Seba bring gifts.

P: May all kings fall down before him, all nations give him service.

L: For he delivers the needy when they call, the poor and those who have no helper.

P: He has pity on the weak and the needy, and saves the lives of the needy.

L: From oppression and violence he redeems their life;

P: and precious is their blood in his sight.

L: The table is set, let us pray.





Frank and Joyce's Fields

In Gwebe village in Malawi, Frank and his wife, Joyce, proudly look over their lush fields. For the past three years, Frank has been using conservation agriculture techniques that were taught to him by Presbyterian World Service & Development partners to help him harvest more. Conservation agriculture teaches farmers to protect and improve soil fertility, conserve water and make locally available resources into fertilizers. Over the years, Frank became a lead farmer in his village. His thriving fields are a reminder of how efficient conservation agriculture can be, setting an example as he teaches and empowers other farmers to use the same methods to increase their harvest.

Thursday, January 7 We pray for the many Women's Missionary Society groups as they begin a new year.


Friday, January 8 We pray for people discerning how they may use their gifts to engage in God's mission in Canada or globally in uncertain times.

Isaiah 60:1-6

¹ Arise, shine; for your light has come,
and the glory of the LORD has risen
upon you.

² For darkness shall cover the earth,
and thick darkness the peoples;
but the LORD will arise upon you,
and his glory will appear over you.

³ Nations shall come to your light,
and kings to the brightness of your
dawn.

⁴ Lift up your eyes and look around;
they all gather together, they come to
you;
your sons shall come from far away,
and your daughters shall be carried on
their nurses' arms.

⁵ Then you shall see and be radiant;
your heart shall thrill and rejoice,
because the abundance of the sea shall be
brought to you,
the wealth of the nations shall come to
you.

⁶ A multitude of camels shall cover you,
the young camels of Midian and
Ephah;
all those from Sheba shall come.
They shall bring gold and frankincense,
and shall proclaim the praise of
the LORD.

Ephesians 3:1-12

¹ This is the reason that I Paul am a
prisoner for Christ Jesus for the sake of you
Gentiles— ² for surely you have already heard
of the commission of God's grace that was
given to me for you, ³ and how the mystery
was made known to me by revelation, as I
wrote above in a few words, ⁴ a reading of
which will enable you to perceive my
understanding of the mystery of Christ. ⁵ In

former generations this mystery was not
made known to humankind, as it has now
been revealed to his holy apostles and
prophets by the Spirit: ⁶ that is, the Gentiles
have become fellow-heirs, members of the
same body, and sharers in the promise in
Christ Jesus through the gospel.

⁷ Of this gospel I have become a servant
according to the gift of God's grace that was
given to me by the working of his
power. ⁸ Although I am the very least of all
the saints, this grace was given to me to bring
to the Gentiles the news of the boundless
riches of Christ, ⁹ and to make everyone
see what is the plan of the mystery hidden
for ages in God who created all things; ¹⁰ so
that through the church the wisdom of God
in its rich variety might now be made known
to the rulers and authorities in the heavenly
places. ¹¹ This was in accordance with the
eternal purpose that he has carried out in
Christ Jesus our Lord, ¹² in whom we have
access to God in boldness and confidence
through faith in him.

Matthew 2:1-12

² In the time of King Herod, after Jesus
was born in Bethlehem of Judea, wise
men from the East came to
Jerusalem, ² asking, 'Where is the child who
has been born king of the Jews? For we
observed his star at its rising, and have come
to pay him homage.' ³ When King Herod
heard this, he was frightened, and all
Jerusalem with him; ⁴ and calling together all
the chief priests and scribes of the people, he
inquired of them where the Messiah was to

be born. ⁵ They told him, 'In Bethlehem of Judea; for so it has been written by the prophet:

⁶ "And you, Bethlehem, in the land of Judah, are by no means least among the rulers of Judah; for from you shall come a ruler who is to shepherd my people Israel."

⁷ Then Herod secretly called for the wise men and learned from them the exact time when the star had appeared. ⁸ Then he sent them to Bethlehem, saying, 'Go and search diligently for the child; and when you have found him, bring me word so that I may also go and pay him homage.' ⁹ When they had heard the king, they set out; and there, ahead of them, went the star that they had seen at its rising, until it stopped over the place where the child was. ¹⁰ When they saw that the star had stopped, they were overwhelmed with joy. ¹¹ On entering the house, they saw the child with Mary his mother; and they knelt down and paid him homage. Then, opening their treasure-chests, they offered him gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh. ¹² And having been warned in a dream not to return to Herod, they left for their own country by another road.
