
Acts 9:36-43

Some Principles of Intergenerational Worship:

- Worship does not have to be radically different, but it must change to take all ages into consideration.
- All forms of liturgy (traditional, contemporary, mixed) can all be embraced.
- Worship needs to become more multi-sensory, how can we pay better attention to what is seen, heard, touched, tasted and smelled?
- Worship needs to experiential; how often are ritual, repetition, silence, wonder and awe planned for? Rituals are great equalizers among generations.
- There is no "right" music style to appeal to everyone, but we may need to expand or preferences.
- Young children sing and learn to sing better with hymn books so they can follow along with their finger and learn to watch the notes.
- Rituals (in Worship) will become even more important because they create and focus the group on a sacred symbol that points to God.
- We need to create opportunities for all generations to connect before, during and after worship.
- Intergenerational worship is not a temporary emphasis, it is a culture shift.
