The season of Lent begins on Ash Wednesday, February 22. Throughout Lent we will be introducing a practice of **Meditative Prayer**. You are encouraged to participate and you can do so in various ways.

- Every Wednesday and Sunday morning at 7 am, a new Lectio Divina Prayer will be posted on the Youtube channel. (https://www.youtube.com/@standrewshespeler73). Subscribe to this channel and you can follow the instructions at a time convenient to you at any time during the week. Videos will average around 12 minutes
- Every Wednesday morning, you can join us **in the sanctuary at 9 am** to do the Lectio Divina of the day together in person.
- Every Monday morning at 7 am, a **meditative prayer** will be posted on the same Youtube channel. You can do this approximately five minute Meditative prayer exercise at a time that works for you during the week.

Do not worry if you are unfamiliar with these practices. We will teach you and walk you through them in a simple to follow way. Meditative practices are learned through repetition, so please be patient with yourself as you learn. Do as many or as few of the prayer practices that fit best into your week!

Next week will be the beginning of our Lenten Journey. During this time we will be "Telling our Stories." Please bring a picture or an object that celebrates an important time in your life with St. Andrew's Hespeler.

Already struggling to overcome political, economic and health crises, Syrians are now faced with the catastrophic effects of a magnitude 7.8 earthquake that struck southeast Türkiye* and northern Syria on February 6. The PCC prays for all those affected by the disaster.

The PCC's partner, the <u>National Evangelical Synod of Syria and Lebanon</u> (<u>NESSL</u>), is responding to the disaster as best it can. NESSL General Secretary, the Rev. Joseph Kassab, said that there is an immediate and desperate need for emergency funds to cover the costs of blankets, mattresses, fuel for generators for heating, medical supplies, diapers and baby formula. In a message from a NESSL contact in Aleppo, the Rev.



Ibrahim Nseir said that people had no warning and time to leave their homes. Many are in shock and don't know what to do, given the extent of the disaster and living through such a traumatic event.

For more information on the earthquake and updates from our partners working in Syria, see the Middle East Council of Churches (MECC) website and view a video in which Safir Salim, a member of the MECC relief team in Aleppo, describes the first moments after the earthquake when they took refuge in the Salesian Church, hoping that it would provide shelter for them.

Mission Moment – Sunday, February 19th

Climate change, conflict and COVID-19 have combined to create a global food crisis where 50 million people in 45 countries suffer from acute hunger. Presbyterian World Service & Development (PWS&D), with Canadian Foodgrains Bank and ACT Alliance, is responding in South Sudan, Pakistan, Yemen and Somalia—countries where hunger needs are worsening daily. This crisis has disproportionately adverse effects on women and girls, who make up 60% of those affected by food insecurity. Without proper nutrition, women can experience higher mortality rates for themselves

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and their children. With support from the church,

World Service PWS&D distributes food packages with essential nourishing items and provides Development families with cash assistance, helping ensure that families are fed.
