**Monday, December 11** Let us take time during this consumer-driven Christmas season to think about and be thankful for what it means to have "enough".


**Tuesday, December 12** This Advent, we give thanks for PWS&D's global partners equipping marginalized communities as they discover hope, peace, joy and love.

## **Mission Moment: December 10**

In northern Ghana, people living with disabilities face a range of issues, such as widespread poverty, limited access to livelihood opportunities and health care, and social barriers to full inclusion. Political, environmental, and economic challenges work together to create those difficult conditions. PWS&D works with the Presbyterian Church of Ghana in a Community-Based Rehabilitation (CBR) program to address these challenges through vocational skills training programs such as soap and pomade making.
