**Mission Moment: July 14**

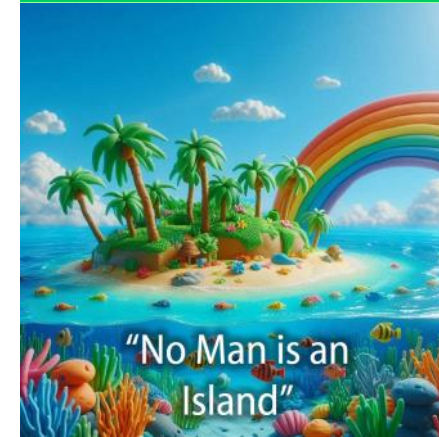

## A Little Bit About St. Andrew's Hespeler

Here are some things you might like to know about St. Andrew's Hespeler:

- The congregation of St. Andrew's Hespeler Presbyterian Church has its origins in the united Congregation of New Hope (Hespeler) and Doon, which called its first minister, Rev. Thomas Hodgskin in 1856. From 1855 to 1863, the congregation in New Hope met for worship in the Royal Templar's Hall on Cooper Street. In 1863, they built a church, which was used until 1908, when the present church on Queen St. was built. In 1892, the Hespeler and Doon congregations were separated. In 1925, the congregation in Hespeler voted to remain with The Presbyterian Church in Canada. In 1988 a Christian Education building was added to the church.
- **Hope Clothing** is a ministry run within St. Andrew's Hespeler. Open every Tuesday mornings and Thursday afternoon (and one Saturday morning and one Wednesday evening a month). We offer clothing and other small items to people free of charge according to their needs.
- St. Andrew's Hespeler hosts the **Cambridge Food Bank** twice a month on Thursday afternoon.
- We also are a host to the Food Bank's **Mobile Food Market** every Wednesday from 12:30 to 1:30 pm. This offers fresh produce to everyone at a very good price — a price that is subsidized for those who cannot afford it.
- We have a long tradition of providing meals to the community (working on establishing a weekly meal at this point).
- We have a veritable army of volunteers from the congregation and community that supports these ministries.
