

Dear members and friends of St. Andrew's Hespeler Presbyterian Church

On Tuesday December 2nd, St. Andrew's is launching its annual *GivingTuesday* campaign. *GivingTuesday* is a global day of giving fueled by the power of social media and collaboration. Celebrated on the Tuesday following the U.S. Thanksgiving and the widely recognized shopping events Black Friday and Cyber Monday, *#GivingTuesday* kicks off the charitable season, when many focus on their holiday and end-of-year giving.

Our *GivingTuesday* campaign this year has a two-fold purpose. First, we'd like to minimize as much of the budgeted deficit we forecast for 2025 as a means by which to establish a strong financial footing going into 2026. In support of this, we have the commitment of matching funds to double the impact of your gift. Currently, the first \$7,500 donated to this campaign will be matched! All moneys raised from this campaign will be designated to the General Fund. The second purpose of this campaign is to increase our collective awareness of where our financial gifts to St. Andrew's are used.

We will highlight these uses of funds on the first three Sundays of December. On the fourth (and last) Sunday in December, we will celebrate both the results from our *GivingTuesday* campaign and the entire year 2025!

- GivingTuesday Campaign gifts can be made online at <u>www.standrewshespeler.ca</u> by using the "Donate Online" button. Once on the donation site, choose the <u>Giving Tuesday Campaign</u> as recipient of your gift.
- GivingTuesday Campaign gifts can also be either sent via mail to the church office or placed on the Sunday morning offering plate. Please do not send cash via external mail.
 - If making a *GivingTuesday* Campaign gift using your Offering Envelope, please clearly mark the amount to be designated to this campaign on the envelope so that it can be distinguished from your regular givings.
 - If not using your Offering Envelope, please ensure the outside of the envelope you do use clearly indicates
 - (a) your name,
 - (b) **your address** and
 - (c) that the amount inside is to be designated to the GivingTuesday Campaign
- All one time GivingTuesday Campaign gifts of \$20 or more will be receipted for tax purposes if a proper name and address is supplied.

What happens when something unexpected happens? We can plan as much as we can, but just like in our personal lives things happen here unexpectedly that just can't be planned. For instance, we found out this summer that the big stained glass window at the back of the sanctuary was in desperate need of care which included scraping all of the old paint off, properly sealing the wood and then repainting. If this had not been done promptly we were risking the health of the wood framing surrounding the panes. The cost of this job was just a bit over \$6000.00.

Gospel: Luke 2:1-20

¹ At that time Emperor Augustus ordered a census to be taken throughout the Roman Empire. ² When this first census took place, Quirinius was the governor of Syria. ³ Everyone, then, went to register himself, each to his own hometown.

⁴ Joseph went from the town of Nazareth in Galilee to the town of Bethlehem in Judea, the birthplace of King David. Joseph went there because he was a descendant of David. ⁵ He went to register with Mary, who was promised in marriage to him. She was pregnant, ⁶ and while they were in Bethlehem, the time came for her to have her baby. ⁷ She gave birth to her first son, wrapped him in cloths and laid him in a manger—there was no room for them to stay in the inn.

⁸ There were some shepherds in that part of the country who were spending the night in the fields, taking care of their flocks. ⁹ An angel of the Lord appeared to them, and the glory of the Lord shone over them. They were terribly afraid, ¹⁰ but the angel said to them, "Don't be afraid! Mission Moment: December 14

Shaibu Mohammed, a 7-year-old boy from Gbanterago in northern Ghana, was born with a disability caused by prolonged labour, and has never walked. Due to a lack of transportation, his parents were unable to enroll him in school. One day, Shaibu's mother walked to the PWS&D -supported Community-Based Rehabilitation Programme (CBR) office to report her son's situation and seek help. After a home visit and assessment, the CBR team provided Shaibu with a tricycle. Additionally,

the Inclusive Education
Officer coordinated with
Gbanterago Primary
School for his
enrollment. Grateful, his
mother said, "My child
can now go to school like
other kids in our
community. What a great
relief! Thank you so
much for this kind
gesture."
