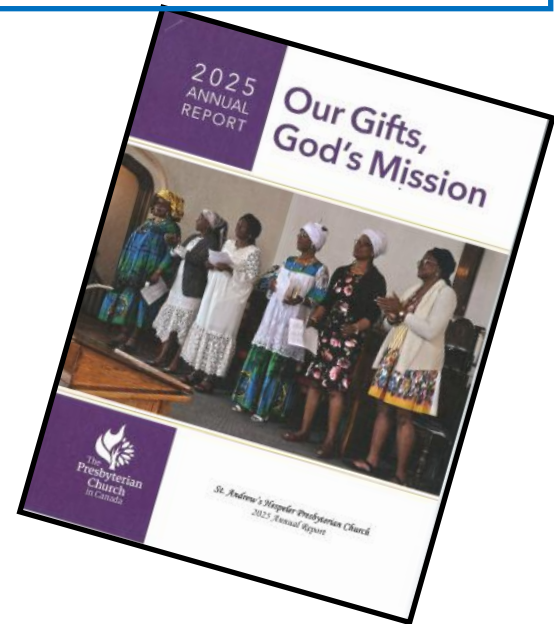

Mission Moment: February 15

In Ghana, communities are increasingly affected by the impacts of climate change. Families face daily difficulties like poverty and limited livelihood options. People with disabilities often face steeper barriers to education, health care and employment. PWS&D helps address these issues with our partner, the Garu Community-Based Rehabilitation (CBR) Program. Domnic Anane, who has a hearing impairment, was trained in climate-resilient agricultural practices and received improved seeds and breeding livestock through the CBR program. “The CBR and PWS&D are God sent. They supported me in engaging in agricultural production. I planted maize, soya bean and sorghum. My crops are looking good, and I am raising sheep alongside. This will help meet the livelihood needs of my family and get us out of poverty,” Domnic said.
